How To Get Rid Of That Xmas Tree

"How am I going to get rid of it when I'm through with it?" is a question many people start asking themselves even before they buy a Christmas tree. In some cities this does present a problem, but it doesn't in this area--as long as the tree is no more than ten feet tall. Silver State Disposal Service will begin picking up the used trees along with their regular garbage collection immediately after Christmas. Trees up to ten feet tall will be picked up if they are placed by the garbage cans. Larger trees will not fit into the trucks

but will be picked up if they are cut into shorter lengths.

In past years a number of people have gotten rid of their trees by burning them. Open burning, including Christmas tree burning, is now prohibited by the Health Department.
