NAACP's Roy Wilkins Lays It On The Line To AFL-CIO Leaders

MIAMI BEACH - (NPI)--NAACP Executive Director Roy Wilkins took his criticism of labor's discriminatory practices to the rostrum of the annual AFL-CIO convention.

And he got what he expected--polite applause and some friendly words from the giant union's president, George Meany.

Despite Wilkins' denunciations and Meany's declaration of good intentions, it remained to be seen whether labor unions would continue to use the "father and son" tradition and other tactics to bar Negroes.

The NAACP chief singled out the plumbers union for special criticism. And he demanded a "new set of enforcement procedures" with building trades unions, where discrimination is most rampant. On the other hand, he praised the industrial unions' "good policies and acts," which "serve to highlight the derelictions of the others."

Meany said he was "completely aware" of the problems Wilkins posed, but "you will not change conditions overnight."

"We keep trying. We are not satisfied with the progress we have made, but we are making progress, and I for one do not resent in any way the report you have given us."

Civil rights leaders were heartened by Meany's friendly statement but hoped AFL-CIO's polite acceptance of Wilkins' attack would not become a dead-end street.

They were concerned about the possibility that bleeding one's heart over the Negro's plight might become an acceptable--even fashionable--substitute for action designed to improve his economic condition.

Whether labor was doing this was an open question. Some leaders said yes, but A. Philip Randolph, president, Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters and an AFL-CIO official, said no.

Positive steps are being taken by unions to end discrimination within their ranks, said Randolph, who praised AFL-CIO's "understanding" on the civil rights issue.

Randolph said he and Wilkins were in "complete agreement on labor's role in the civil rights question," although they stressed different aspects of the problem.

While Wilkins was calling for labor action against discrimination, Gary NAACP officials announced a campaign to integrate the trade and crafts unions and their apprenticeship programs.

"Negro youths of Lake County are denied membership in some of these unions because of discriminatory practices used in keeping these local unions lily white," an NAACP official said.

The action contemplated by the NAACP was not disclosed.
