Jishing By "The Crappie Catcher"

Didn't We Tell You?

Apparently the fish in Lake Mead heard the news that they were all washed up or perhaps they read the Crappie Catcher that February was the month for the Crappie to bite. The Crappie have made our prediction look good and have put the kill-joy people to shame.

Reports from all of the favorite fishing areas of the lake have been getting better each week for the past two weeks. We predict that the news will be even better during the next few weeks.

The fish are beginning to school and are preparing for their Spring spawning. The Bass and Crappie are, both feeding and fattening themselves for their spawning which will probably be early this year. They are beginning to move into the coves.

Good catches of both varieties have been made in the Muddy, just above Overton, as well as off Sandy Point below Overton. Echo Bay and Goat Island have been producing good results. Iceberg Canyon has also been good.

We have not heard any reports from Ugly Ike's Hole which is listed on Lake Mead charts as Sunfish Cove, but whenever the Crappie bite in the Içeberg area, you can always find them at Ugly Ike's, which is the last cove you reach just before you get to Iceberg Canyon.

Small minnows or small shiners are the best bait for Crappie. Large minnows or large shiners are best for Bass. The latter are also excellent for Catfish. No one has reported anything favorable with water dogs for the past few months, except for spotty catches of Cats and Bass, but both varieties have been biting better on large minnows than on dogs.

Although we have heard nothing from Stewart's Point, you can bet that fish can be caught in your favorite spots in that area. When the Crappie gather to spawn, Stewart's Point is always one of their gathering places.
