men did not have some special training or proficiency vital to their unit's operation, they might not be there.

That this kind of separatism and discrimination could, and has existed for so long, is understandable in the light of all the other things that have happened to the Negro.

What is ironic, is that in the face of long hot summers and riots, some factions are suggesting using more Negroes as Guardsmen, while others are politically and systematically reorganizing the Negroes out of the few remaining command positions in Guard units in northern states.

The social unrest of the Negro will be joined this summer by the unrest of peace demonstrators, adding to the need for more in-depth considerations on domestic social problems by federal, state and local governments--with the calling out of the Guard as a last alternative.

This is not the case, however. In every part of the country, the riots, demonstrations and unrest of the nation's people are increasingly spilling into the streets.

The cry of "outside agitators" and "Call out the Guard" are becoming solutions to any and all problems. And when the shooting and killing is over, the Guard is blamed for all that went wrong, and all that is still wrong.

The turning point in the relationship of Negroes and the National Guard was 1965, the year of the first major riots by Negroes as a means of protesting. Since then, the Negro and the Guard have had to reorganize each its own methods and its role in accomplishing its objectives.
