

Plan DuBoise Memorial

GREAT BARRINGTON, Mass. - (NPI)--The DuBois Memorial Committee is seeking to have the five-acre family farmstead of the late W.E. B. DuBois designated as a state park by Massachusetts.

The site has been offered to the state as an historic monument. When fully developed, the Memorial will be open to the public and will include an outdoor auditorium, a Negro History Museum, and eventually, DuBois' restored home, which was destroyed several years ago.

The committee, headed by Walter Wilson, real estate broker, plans to establish a memorial at the DuBois homestead where the community leader was born on Feb. 23, 1868.

DuBois, who died in 1963, is remembered as the editor of the NAACP's magazine "Crisis," and the militant opponent of Booker T. Washington.

Lay Singer's Death To Overdose Of Narcotics

NEW YORK--(LDA)--Frankie Lymon, 26year-old rhythm and blues singer who rose to fame with his own teenage recording group, died last week of an apparent overdose of narcotics, according to police here.

Lymon was home on leave from his Army post at Fort Gordon, Ga. Police reported that his body was found in the apartment of Walter Stribling, a friend of the dead singer, in Man-

Just before he entered the U.S. Army, Lymon authored a magazine article detailing how he had "kicked" the narcotic habit and he was considered to be "clean" at the time of his induction.

In Detroit, however, the Rev. Dr. James F. Jones, nationally-known as "Prophet Jones," could not be reached for comment on the death of this famed singer.

Last month, at an elaborate banquet in his mansion on Detroit's fashionable Westside, Prophet Jones had predicted that a "famed entertainer will go to sleep and never wake up again. The famous religious leader would not divulge the name of the entertainer.

Prophet Jones predicted the death of Dorothy Dandridge, Sam Cooke and Nat "King" Cole.

Lymon was arrested in 1966 for possession of narcotics and he alleged voluntarily entered a hospital for the cure. His former recording group, "The Teenagers," waxed "Why Do Fools Fall In Love."
