# "Will Battle To Bitter **End For Open Housing**

WASHINGTON--(NNPA)-President Johnson told a group of Negro editors and publishers Friday that his Administration is prepared to "battle to the end" for "open and decent housing for all Americans.

But the Nation's Chief Executive said he was concerned about the passage in the House of the Senate-approved Civil Rights Bill that contains the most sweeping open housing provision in history. "If you don't have open housing... a decent place to live...you don't have first class citizenship," he said.

## Wilkins Raps Militants

NEW YORK - (NPI)--Roy Wilkins, NAACP executive director, has attacked black militants for failing to help get a civil rights bill passed this year. According to Wilkins, the militants are obstructionists, not builders.

"They want to fight the white man," he said.

"But they don't turn that energy inward and talk about building themselves."

Wilkins described his militant critics as a small minority "that is light on work unless that work is creating mischief and embarrassment for somebody.

The civil-rights leader defended use of the word "Negro" and the words "colored people" in his organization's name.

Your name is that by which you're known. It doesn't make any difference whether you call yourself black, Afro-American, or Negro. You're still the same person.
