Action Program On Kerner Report Recommendations

WASHINGTON, April 2....A nationwide campaign to spur support for implementation of the recommendations of the Kerner Commission report was announced tonight by the AMERICAN JEWISH COMMITTEE.

At an extraordinary meeting of its Board of Governors, held in Washington to dramatize what was called "the urgent need" as well as to give policy-making AJC members an opportunity to convey their concern to appropriate Government officials, a three-part program was unfolded:

* To convene regional meetings of AJC chapters and units where members in all parts of the country will be able to map plans on how they can best involve themselves in the implementation activity;

* To call community-wide conferences in cities where AJC chapters and units exist, for the purpose of revealing the pressure points in American cities that have the potential for creating summer disorder, and to undertake commensurate activity in such crucial areas as employment, housing, services to young people, etc.

* To report back for further AJC action in this area at the COMMITTEE's 62nd annual meeting, to be held in New York May 23-26.

The first of the three AJC regional meetings took place Wednesday, April 3, when all chapters and units of the Eastern seaboard gathered for an all-day session at the Bellevue Stratford Hotel, Philadelphia. Midwestern chapters and units will meet Friday, April 5, at the Standard Club in Chicago, and West Coast chapters and units are to convene Wednesday, April 10, at the International Hotel at the Los Angeles Airport.

In announcing the program, Orin Lehman, chairman of the AJC Board of Governors, its ruling body, said:

"As white Americans, as Jews, as members of the AMERICAN JEWISH COMMITTEE, we address ourselves now to what we can do to help end the legacy of America's racism, and what our members can do in their own communities to implement the recommendations of the Kerner Report. We emphasize the fact that

this is a white problem, and that our activity is geared primarily to what we as white American can do."

FOLLOWING THE initial JAC regional meetings, members will be urged to enlist in local community-wide coalitions with such organizations as community relations and human relations agencies, local government agencies, youth-serving organizations, business organizations as well as individual businessmen, organized religious groups, labor unions, chambers of commerce and business and industry associations, PTA's, fraternal organizations and service organizations such as Lions and Rotary.

In each area, the AJC will urge fact-gathering that can be helpful in making the communities conscious of the relevancy of the Kerner Commission report to their own communities, and in that way increase awareness that the Kerner Commission does not deal in abstractions. Some of the topics suggested for inclusion in such fact-gathering are: levels of unemployment, facilities available for vocational training and job placement, welfare levels, available low-cost housing, education of police personnel, plans by city administrations for the coming summer, organizations of young Negroes, organizations of young whites, volunteer youth-serving agencies.

"In all cases," Mr. Lehman observed, "the thrust is to keep the issues raised by the Kerner Report alive and dramatic, pinpointing the factors that are likely to be inflammatory in the community, based on the warnings of the Kerner Report."

Mr. Lehman pointed out that the AMERICAN JEWISH COMMITTEE already was engaged in several projects in areas urged by the Kerner Commission's report to correct the imbalance between white and Negro in America.
