

The Crappie Catcher didn't take a powder during the past two weeks. He was landlocked with his tax accountant to figure how much money he owed to his silent partner, Uncle Sam. Even if the going had not been rough with the tax business, the winds have kept our local waters so rough it would have been very tough going to have been on Lake Mead any day during the past two weeks.

Strong winds and rough water not withstanding, many dedicated nimrods have ventured out on the lake to fish with reasonably good results. Reports from both the Temple Bar region and the Overton area have been most encouraging. Good reports have also been received from Vegas Wash, as well as from Nelson.

Provided the weather returns to normal, with more sun and less wind, the coming dark of the moon should be the best fishing of the year for night fishing. This does not mean that where ever you drop your line you are going to catch fish. First you will have to find out from the more venturesome nimrods where they have spotted spawning activities. If you cannot get this information from someone, you will have to rely upon trying your luck in those spots where you have known fish to spawn in previous years. A more reliable method of finding the right spots would be to explore the most likely spawning grounds for activity during the day. Try to pick out 2 or 3 coves close together where signs of spawning have been detected. If the first one you fish does not pay off, move to one of the others. Be certain to have picked out your landmarks and pictured the skyline in sufficient detail to guide you back to the right spots after darkness sets in.

The water looks entirely different by day than it does by night. You cannot rely upon finding the right cove at night by merely locating it by \*its appearance. You must have a vivid picture of the shore, the mountains, and some definite landmarks, if you expect to find your fishing hole at night. All night fishermen who have depended upon anything less than those 3 locators, have fished the entire night thinking they were in a certain cove, and been surprised to find out at daybreak that they had been fishing in some place other than where they had thought they were.

Make a study of the skyline and relate it to certain landmarks. The tops of the hills and mountains are excellent night guides to find your favorite spots at night.


Police said the clerk, David Newborn, objected to the noise made by Roy and his brother, Alexander, 12, as they ran in and out of the building in which the Innises live.
