serve the people any time they need him -- and he is ready to answer the call.

This also raises the question of the next election, and how many sessions we will send legislators to Carson City who are not in favor of our request for a special session on civil rights. We believe that Negroes have a responsibility to call upon their legislators and discuss the urgency of dealing with these problems now. We believe Negroes have a responsibility to register and to vote in behalf of progress in civil rights matters.

We do not have years and years to think about the civil rights problems which exist right now in the state. We believe they must have immediate attention from a special session now. We would appreciate all the support from southern Nevada that we can get.
