

Number Of Southern Negro Elected Officials Swells

ATLANTA - (NPI) -- Louisiana leads the South in the number of elected Negro officials, with Arkansas, Tennessee, and Mississippi trailing not far behind.

According to a study of Negro office-holding the South, 248 black officials hold elective office in the states of the old Confederacy.

The number is a considerable increase over previous years, especially in Deep South states. The rise is due largely to considerable voter registration among Negroes in those states, combined with the fact that a substantial portion of the population in Lower Dixie is black.

In Louisiana, 38 Negroes hold elective office, followed by Arkansas with 33 and Mississippi and Tennessee with 28.

Alabama and Virginia have 24; Georgia, 21; Florida, 16; Texas 15, South Carolina, 11; and North Carolina, 10.

The most significant rise in the number of elected Negro officials is in Louisiana and Mississippi. Of Louisiana's 38 Negro elected officials, 35 were chosen within the past year. Twenty-two of Mississippi's 28 officeholders were elected last fall.

Much of the upsurge in Negro political leadership in Mississippi is due to increased voter registration.

Since August 1965, when the federal Voting Rights, Act was passed, the number of Negro voters in Mississippi has increased from 35,-000 to 264,000. Sixty per cent of the state's eligible Negro voters are registered--near the national average.

Throughout the South, about three million Negroes are registered to vote--again, about 60 per cent of the adult black population.
