COURT RULING

WASHINGTON - (NPI)--An 1870 criminal conspiracy law may be used to prosecute anyone attacking or intimidating Negroes using public accommodations opened to them by Congress in 1964, the U.S. Supreme Court has ruled.

The Court, in a 5-to-3 decision, reversed a lower court's dismissal of an indictment against four white men accused of beating three Negro travelers who were eating in a roadside restaurant in Braselton, Ga.

There are ten (10) apprenticeship openings.

All applicants must fully meet the following minimum qualifications in order to qualify for interview:

1. Age - 18 to 24 inclusive - A maximum of 4 years adjustment for military service is available for those who qualify.
2. Education - High School Graduate (transcript required).
3. Aptitude Test - Given by employment office (date assigned to applicant when application is submitted).
4. Submit photo-copy of birth certificate.
5. Submit photo-copy of honorable discharge/separation papers.

Each applicant who meets all minimum requirements will be interviewed by the Committee to determine his qualifications beyond minimum requirements. The interview will consider:

- a. General education background with particular emphasis on Math and Science courses.
