That's not all, . . . Yours truly, presents the number one rated soul disc jockey in all of Vegas, Gino Jackson with Gino Jackson "G.I." night. Whew! SUGAR HILL is definitely where it's at baby.

RUBENS, located at 'H' and Owens, now features the Richard Dorsey trio. Some might call the trio something else, but it's primarily the same group, I've been seeing for a month now, so as far as I'm concerned it's still the Richard Dorsey Trio.

Lowdry, Covington, Ky., by the Associated Physicians of Cook County Hospital of Chicago for the study of medicine at Meharry Medical College, Nashville, Tenn. The purpose of the AP grants is to motivate students with potential ability for medicine.
