**VA Information**

Fewer than seven per cent of the 19,000 G.I. home loans guaranteed by the Veterans Administration in August involved a sales price above the VA "reasonable value" appraisal. Of the 1,192 homes sold to veterans at a price above the VA appraisal, only 144 involved a difference of \$1,500 or more between the reasonable value set by VA and the selling price of the home. In many cases, the difference was as little as \$50--the smallest increment used by VA to measure variations from appraised value. Under a law signed by President Johnson last May, veterans for the first time are permitted to pay more for a home than the VA reasonable value appraisal and still qualify for a VA guaranty.

**Ownership Survey**

NEW YORK - (NPI)--A survey of business ownership in a 20-block area in the heart of Harlem has found that Black people own 58 per cent of the stores in the area. The survey conducted by the American Jewish Congress, refutes the demagogic charge that most businesses in the area are Jewish-owned. As for the notion that more Black ownership businesses in Harlem would "keep money in the ghetto," it was found that a majority of Black people who own businesses in Harlem do not live there.
