The beautiful and spacious home of Mr. and Mrs. Roderick McSwain, better known as Barbara and "Rod", was the perfect setting for a get-acquainted party honoring Nevada's distinguished SENATOR ALAN BIBLE.

Total success was not only due to the presence of other well-known candidates such as Paul May, Bob Bradley, Bob Reid, Marvin White and Ed Young, and dozens of loyal democrats, but more so successful because of the "esprit de corp", that is, enthusiasm, joy, determination, sincerity, and optimism mirrored on the happy faces milling around the various rooms, exchanging words of assurance, partaking of the various delicacies prepared by the genial host and hostess, and also sipping "Rod's" famous concoction the "Presbyterian".

Following a period of picture taking, the group listened intently to the acceptance speech from Senator Bible whom we now quote in part:

"The campaign trail is very interesting and sometimes agonizing. I hope we last long enough to let the historians judge... You can't tell how history is going to fall. I am not going to tell anybody that I am going to change it all."

"I have worked, first as Attorney General and then Senator. I have a good, decent record... The main one I would point to is TRYING TO HELP PEOPLE. Those of us in Washington don't always agree but that's the way things go. I don't always agree with my wife, especially when she goes into a dress shop. (smiles)... If you don't have a strong family tree, you are in trouble and America is in trouble.

"We have tried to make Nevada a great State. We have not accomplished everything, but we have tried. This is my fourteenth year of service in the United States Senate. With the efforts of Senators Cannon and Walter Baring, we got the Water Pollution Control. The main concern with people is getting an honest and decent job. This is a great state. It is nice to see a man like BOB REID coming in this evening. He is a fine Public Servant. I am mighty proud to have my picture taken with everyone here tonight for they are good, decent Americans."

"I suppose that if there is a lesson at the end of a long beautiful day is that we need more understanding, respect, and tolerance for people."

After hailing Mayor Lindsay as a great Mayor and pointing out some of his good deeds, Senator Bible said to all present: "Ask me any questions and if I can't answer, I have brought Mike Sloan along." (Chuckles)

Following the question and answer period other candidates spoke: PAUL MAY, Democrat Assembly, N.L.V., District #2, and only incumbent in the North Las Vegas race spoke. May is a man of great experience having actively participated in many, many community activities such as Chairman March of Dimes, Member Nevada Safety Council, North Las Vegas Elks Lodge No. 2353, Bd. of Director Camp Fire Girls of North Las Vegas, American Legion N.L.V. Post, Fraternal Order of Police Associates representing North Las Vegas.

In the Legislature he served effectively as Chairman of the Committee on Building and Construction, Vice Chairman Committee on Fish and Game, Public Health and Morals. Nevada needs Paul May.

MARVIN WHITE, candidate for State Senate District #2, was the next speaker and we quote: "There is no problem that good people cannot sit down and talk about and arrive at a favorable solution. I will oppose tax increase. I am not in favor of any tax."

White's platform includes Responsible Leadership, Business Growth, Community Spirit, Expanding the Community and Educational Opportunities. He is said to be "a man offering more than a promise--a man with a
