HOLLYWOOD--Actor Bob Culp, after many months as star with Bill Cosby on television's "I Spy" series, is now heavily and happily in independent TV production.

His first big sale, a hard-news documentary program, is titled "Operation Breadbasket," an incisive look into poverty and rights deprivation. ABC-TV will air the Culp documentary July 7 nationwide.

Culp is a close friend of the Rev. Andrew Young, of SCLC, and once told a national audience on the Joey Bishop Show that the Rev. Young "is my pastor, my friend and my counsellor."

Reports, are that ABC also has an option on a series of six formats by Culp. These include personal, close-up views of top stars, like Marlon Brando's views on U.S. Indians, Nancy Wilson and Bill Cosby's views on "dropout" problems of youth, and Harry Belafonte's views on unions, guilds and apprentice programs as affecting minorities.

CULP describes "Operation Breadbasket" as "a constructive, nonviolent and logical answer to the problem of the ghetto." His production firm is named the Ahad Foundation --Artists Helping The American Black Com-munity. Officers include Sidney Poitier and Bill Cosby.
