## NAACP WINS THALHEIMER AWARD:

- At the recent NAACP Convention held in Jackson, Mississippi, the Las Vegas Branch of the NAACP, won for the second year in succession, the Thalheimer Award, as the outstanding branch in the country, operating without paid personnel. The convention was attended by Atty. Charles Kellar, President; Rev. Marion Bennett, Treasurer; and Assemblyman Woodrow Wilson, who is a Member of the Board, a native of Mississippi, and a graduate of Pineywood Institute nearby.

## EDUGATION:

- On Saturday July 19th, selected members of the community met with Kenny Guinn, Superintendent of Schools. They discussed the policies to be instituted by the Clark County School District, to carry out the integration plan ordered by Federal Judge Bruce Thompson. The staff of the schools are to be integrated by September 15, and the pupils by February 15, 1970.

Most of the discussion was centered around the proposed CVT Gilbert Prestige School. Many vital questions were hurled at the new Superintendent who promised to do his best. He specifically stated that "I'm not here to go around the Mulberry Bush. I did that once and I won't do it again.'

Mr. Guinn was asked by Rev. Donald Clark: "Have you volunteered your kids for enroll-ment?" The reply was "No". Rev. Clark then said, "How are you going to get others to volunteer their kids if you don't lead?" (meaning you and other administrators) "You say this is a program to follow yet you wouldn't participate in it." Attorney Kellar concluded that "the Negro must help America erase its double standard." Guinn was told that if he makes a sincere effort to meet the needs of the black community he will get their support, if not he will be severely pressured.


