Reno Mayor Seeks Negro On Urban Renewal Board

Reno -- Mayor Roy Bankofier said Monday he will seek to fill a vacancy on the Reno Urban Renewal Board from the city's black community.

A group called the Afro-Americans for Black Liberation was organized a week ago and asked officials to include blacks on city boards, including Urban Renewal.

The opening was created when Harry Linnecke, named to the board last week, declined the post because of a possible conflict of interest over property owned by his family.

Bankofier said he has one Negro under consideration and wants names of others who might be inter-

Ga. Death Penalty Live s

Atlanta, Ga. -- An attempt to abolish capital punishment in Georgia went down to sudden defeat last week.

Two black legislators, Rep. Bobby Hill of Savannah and Rep. Julian Bond of Atlanta, tried to amend the Bill of Rights of the state's proposed constitution, now under consideration by the Georgia House.

The amendment, authored by Rep. Hill and co-sponsored by Rep. Bond, would have changed a sentence in the Georgia Bill of Rights so it would read: "No person shall be deprived of his life. No person shall be deprived of liberty or property without due process of law."

By a vote of 125 to 13, the House voted to retain the present language which reads: "No person shall be deprived of life, liberty or property without due process of law."
