Arkansas Mechanical College Alumni

In 1961 a group of graduates from Arkansas AM&N College decided to establish an Alumni Association of that College, with the prime purpose of lending financial support to the institution and providing financial assistance to graduates of the local high schools.

The group chose its first president the illustrious James A. Gay III. A man of giant stature, a graduate of the institution, a member of the Nevada Boxing Commission, licensed mortician, a member of the NAACP, A trustee at Second Baptist Church, a member of the board of directors of the Culinary Union and a member of the National Conference of Christians & Jews.

For many years, he has awarded trophies to outstanding athletes at the college. He established a trust fund insured by Lords of London to award these trophies fifty years after his death.

From its inception, the organization has been involved in activities that sought to inspire the youth in the local community. It has awarded twelve scholarships to local youths, two of which have graduated. It has financed summer remedial reading classes and presented the



Choir from AM&N College twice to this community. This institution has the largest percentage of Black Educators in the Clark County School District, more than any other school in the Nation.

This year the organization proposes, in addition to its founding purpose, to have each member lend assistance to a graduate senior of Valley High School in an effort to assist him during the coming school year and after graduation in choosing his life's work.
