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Naugle Files For Board Of Education

Carl Naugle of Las Veg-as filed for the State Board of Education today. He is the Industrial Relations Manager of EG&G, an electronics firm at the test site.

Naugle said he is running because he thinks more board members must be elected from Southern Nevada to help solve the "big city" challenges developing in that rapidly growing urban area.

According to Naugle the policy-making Board of Education will be dealing with several new chal-lenges of public education in Nevada: First, and possibly foremost, will be employee bargaining organizations. This will be followed closely by the challenge of meeting the demand for community college services speedily and smoothly; people with children in high school want a program underway promptly. Then there is the matter of general impatience which will require a truely responsive board to meet the needs of students, teachers, taxpayers, and parents.
