

## HOLLYWOOD TRIO TO PLAY MATINEE DANCE AT DOOLITTLE CENTER

A letter from ace publicist Vincent Tubbs, now jaunting around Italy, France and Spain—with some time out on the French Riviera—looking for two black beauties, film actresses Marpessa Dawn (of "Black Orpheus") and Danyale Luna, the ex-model from Detroit who appeared most recently in "Satyricon."

The two ladies are wanted for Steve McQueen's racing feature, "The 24 Hours of Le Mans," now filming in France. And Tubbs is a publicity man

for McQueen and the movie.

Tubbs, who was once prexy of the Hollywood Publicists Guild, added this note: "in line with your repeated column suggestion that blackfilm stars should also get themselves black publicists, isn't it interesting that film studios put a black man (ME) on their multi-million-dollar pictures, and I handle such top-bracket actors as Marlon Brando, Audrey Hepburn, Dustin Hoffman and Steve McQueen and yet our black actors and a ctresses are all signed up with white publicists?"

RAN INTO dapper Warren Cowan of Rogers, Cowan & Brenner, at the Nancy Olson-Natalie Wood party for Dory Previn (wife of Andre) at the Olson home in Beverly Hills. He'd arrived only monents before from London, where he'd attended a big party for Stevie Wonder and Stevie's wife-to-be, Syreeta, at the Talk of the Town. Cowan said that on the plane back he'd read the trade-paper accounts of our efforts to get black publicists on staffs of white firms

Said He: "Bill, it's very hard to find qualified black publicists. I know, you can get black newsmen from around the country, and they can write good news copy, but it's something else getting a person who knows the fine points of promoting, guiding, counseling, and showing off the very best sides of the client to the public. I must say, we have a grand black publicists on our staff in Bob Jones. I have to confess, we were not looking for a black publicists when he insisted himself upon us, but thank heavens he did."

RCB handles public relations for most of Motown's artists, but works very closely in their overall promotions with Berry Gordy, Jr., and Motown's black director of publicity, Junius

Griffin.

DORY PREVIN, by the way, while awaiting her "finals" splitee from Andre Previn, will have a film produced soon based on her autobiog. She's writing it and the songs---and tells all! Producing the movie and a Dory Previn album are Richard Gregson (husband of Natalie Wood) and ex-Capitol Records exec. Alan Livingston, husband of Nancy Olson. Dory, who did music work on "Thoroughly Modern Millie" when Andre dropped out, is now doing music with Elmer Bernstein for Broadway's "Great Expectations."

SHORTIES: Clara Ward writes from the French Riviera where she's set to appear in the 11th Annual French Jazz Festival. Motown hosted 350 Compton underprivileged to the Tempts show at the Greek, and the Panthers bussed in scores of ghetto kids to the same show, with tickets free from The Temptations. Diana Ross planed in from London to attend a blase barbecue at Mary Wilson's new palace in the hills.

LEON RENE, the composer, sent us a copy of the telegram he sent to Louis Armstrong at his recent birthday ball here: "Had it not been for that gumbo dinner cooked by Mama Renee in your honor in Pasadena, "Sleepy Time Down South" would be just another song. Leon, and his late brother Otis, along with Clarence Muse, wrote the song, which Louis first recorded April 20, 1931, a year after the Rene brothers had given it to him.

At that time (in 1930) Louis also recorded Andy Razaf and Eudib Blake's "Memories of You," in L. A., with the Les Hite band, featuring Lawrence Brown and Marshal Royal (now with the George Rhodes band at the Now Grove after years with Basie), and a then 17-year-old drummer named Lionel Hampton.


