Assemblyman Wilson Files for Reelection

Assemblyman Woodrow Wilson filed for reelection to a third term in the State Assembly, District 4, on the Republican ticket.

During the 1969 session of the Legislature, Wilson was Chairman, Health and Welfare Committee; Vice Chairman, Labor Committee; member, Education Committee; and a member of the Legislative Commission's Social Welfare Study Subcommittee.

Wilson feels, "The next session of the Legislature will deal with the greatest number of complex problems to confront the citizens of Nevada in the last several decades: reapportionment, crime, inflation, air pollution, inadequate funds for education, and the broad spectrum of social problems."

Wilson was one of 30 black elected official selected throughout the United States to attend a planning conference co-sponsored by the National Urban Coalition and the Metropolitan Allied Research Center, which met last month

in Washington, D. C. As the only Negro in the State Legislature, Wilson is asked to serve on many boards and commissions with local and statewide scope: Nevada State Commission on Crime; delinquency and correction; Chairman, Nevada State Advisory Committee; U. S. Commission on Civil Rights; State Vocational Education Advisory Committee; and Advisory Council Southwest Regional Laboratory for Educational Research and Development.

Assemblyman and Mrs. Wilson reside at 625 Frederick Avenue, Las Vegas.

Experiments in group psychotherapy among the police, racially mixed groups, private business and governmental agencies could go a long way toward reducing the social tensions that exist in the United States today.

This theory is advanced by Dr. Carl Rogers, resident fellow at the Center for the Studies of the Person in La Jolla, California, on the second color-film segment of "Science and Society," a three-part half-hour interview series. The Rogers interview airs Sunday, July 26 at 8:30 on Chambel 10, a member of the Public Television Service.

Rogers, a pioneer in the use of encounter groups for psychotherapy, concedes these groups

might not want to sit down together.

"I'm sure you would find reluctance, suspicion, and distrust," he tells interviewer Dr. Paul Saltman, a biochemist and provost of Revelle College at the University of California at San Deigo. "But there would be at least one group that would be very much interested in

the encounter approach.

"And you'd want to start with this willing group and carry on from there. A great deal more would be done than is being done right

"I think it's a tragedy that more isn't being done in using group psychotherapy as an instrument to constructively reduce social tension.'
