Election of Thomas A. Wood, president of TAW International Leasing, Inc., to the Boards of Directors of The Chase Manhattan Corporation and The Chase Manhattan Bank was announced today by Chairman David Rockefeller.

Mr. Wood's firm is a multinational leasing company operating primarily on the African continent. He is also a director of Gouridine Systems, Inc., Fecor Industries, Ltd., and The Greer Children's Community.

A onetime basketball star at Columbia University, where he received an A.B. degree, Mr. Wood did further work at the University of Michigan, where he earned a B.S.E.E. degree, and at Massachusetts Institute of Technology and Wayne State University.

He was a founder and president for six years of Decision Systems, Inc., a publicly held corporation in the systems engineering and computer programming field.

Prior to this, Mr. Wood was employed by the International Electric Corporation, a subsidiary of the International Telephone and Telegraph Corporation, where he served as director of the Systems Programming Division. He also worked for six years as chief of the Computer Branch of the Research and Development Division of the U. S. Ordnance Tank Automotive Center.

Mr. Wood, 44, lives in New Jersey, with his wife, the former Barbara Van Dyke, and their four children.
