Age Group at their October meeting.

Harmon called for the removal of the state excise taxes on all food and drug items, and also promised to introduce legislation which would permit the Public Service Commission to offer reduced bus fare rates to all Senior Citizens.

"Fireproof" Your House HELP WANTED **By Eliminating Rubbish**

Fives times an hour - 120 times a day, a U. S. Home is destroyed or damaged by a

fire which started in, or was fed by, rubbish. So here's a good place to start in "fireproofing" your house. Not only should you dispose of rubbish regularly, byt you should store it in a fire-safe containers until the refuse collectors have removed it from the premises. That's the advice from Cheif J. D. Miller, Las Vegas Fire Department.

Much of what the average person describes as "gargabe" or rubbish is flammable, Chief Miller said. Aand such material, improperly stored, acn catch fire and lead to disaster. That's why local fire officials recomment that homeowners use non-flammable galvanized steel containers for storage of all trash, rubbish and garbage -- both inside and outside the house.

It is a good idea to have metal cans of this type in the basement, garage and utility room -particulary in workshop areas to collect sawdust, shavings, and wood scraps, oily rags and the like.

All trash cans should be equipped with closefitting covers, so that even if fire should start in the metal container, it will not spread, Cheif Miller said.

To put out the fire will require only the placeing of the cover on the container. Completely confined, the fire will quickly exhaust the air supply in the can, and burn itself out in a matter of minutes.

Among the most flammable itens around the house are newspapers and magazines. Don't let them accumulate. Paint cans with small amounts of paint -- probably hardened and not usable -- also should be discarded. Don't let them lie around where they would merely supply fuel should a fire break out.


