Notice To ADC Parents

If you have any earnings during the month you must report them to your eligibility worker by the 15th of the month. You must show your worker checks or check stubs or employer's receipts, or if you have nothing else, a signed statement from your employer.

You may show these things to your worker in person in the office, or may send them to your worker in the mail.

You must report any earnings made each month. Example: By the 15th of October you will report earnings from September 15 to Oct-ober 15th.

Any month you have earnings, and fail to verify them with your worker your welfare check for the next month will be held until you have shown your worker the verifications needed.
