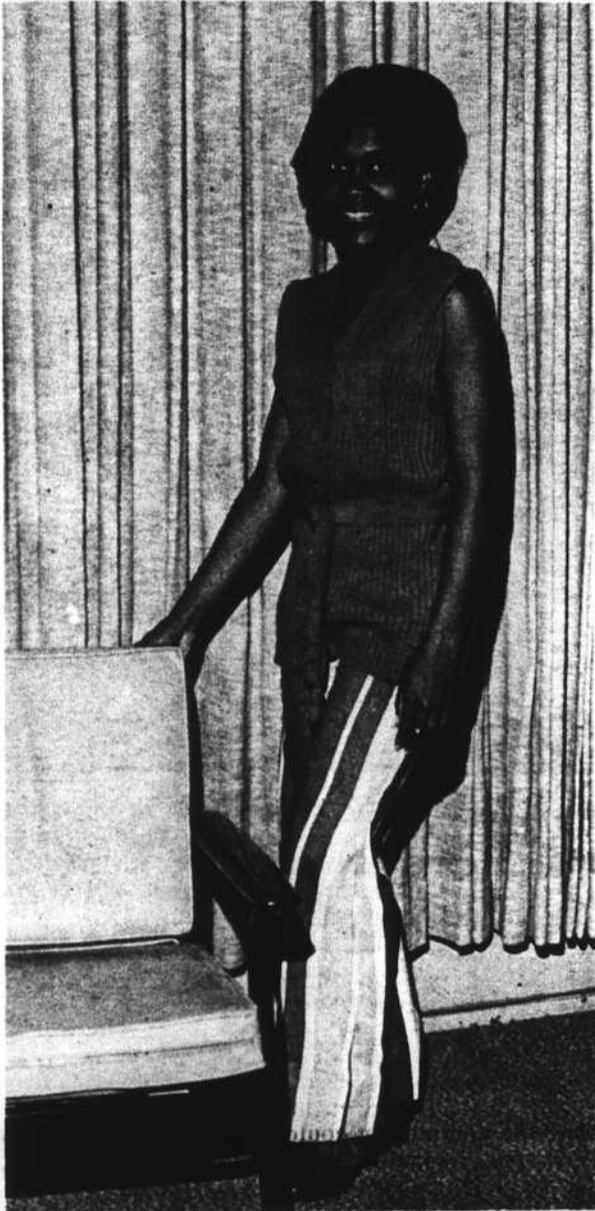


THE SEEN AT THE SCENE
