Percy Smith, Jr., Detroit Lee, Wilpha Harrell, Jr., T.Y. Rogers and Thornton Stanley (all of Alabama). The one Congressional candidate who was not a third party nominee was Atlanta's Andrew Young, the former aid to the late Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. A candidate on the Democratic ticket, Young, who some analysts thought had a chance to gain a seat in the U. S. House from Georgia, was outpolled by two-term GOP incumbent Fletcher Thompson for the 5th Congressional District seat.

Parren Mitchell not only was the lone black candidate from the South to win a seat in Congress, but the way he won it is considered to be politically significant. His vote margin over Republican Peter Parker was 58,986 to 42,024 in a district that is not predominantly black. The ethnic makeup of the district is 40 percent Jewish, 20 percent White and 40 percent Black. One observer called Mitchell's winning combination a "volunteer coalition of street dudes and whites".

Commenting on his historic victory, Mitchell said: "It showed sophistication and maturity by the white portion of the district in its willingness to accept the full participation of Negroes in the political process."

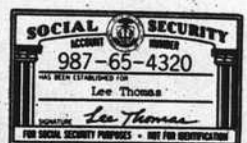
