

# INAUGURAL BALL JAN. 30

The Southern Nevada Inaugural Ball for Governor-elect Mike O'Callaghan will be held in the Convention Center Rotunda, Saturday evening, January 30, beginning at 9:30 p.m., it was announced by Honorary Chairman Grant Sawyer, Democratic National Committeeman and former Governor.

The formal inauguration of O'Callaghan will take place Monday, January 4 at 11:30 a.m. in front of the State Capitol in Carson City. The Inaugural Ball for that area will be held Friday evening January 8 in Reno.

Sawyer said committees for the Las Vegas event are now being formed and are expected to be functioning fully by December 15, which will allow them six weeks to arrange for what is expected to be the largest Inaugural Ball in Nevada History.

Presiding Chairman for the affair is Democratic State Chairman Phil Carlino, Coordinating Chairmen are Mrs. Harry Claiborne, President of the Women's Democratic Club, and Mrs. Jack Walsh.

Programming Chairman is Dolores Gilmore, Protocol Chairman is Col. Don Charmichael and Public Relations Chairman is City Commissioner Hank Thornley.

Sawyer said a complete list of working committee chairmanships will be announced following completion of committee assignments, expected within the next week.
