effort' to go to the offices of a poverty program and meet with the various groups in the minority community to reiterate the fact that "equal opportunity" is more than mere words and that the opportunities heretofore denied them are now a reality.

I state, unequivocally, that I am against the pre-apprenticeship training concept. I know from experience that there are Blacks and other minorities who have passed tests and are currently qualified to be placed on regular, on-going apprenticeship programs and I feel that, rather than use the pre-apprenticeship approach, we should look at more stringent enforcement of existing equal employment laws for getting more minorities into apprenticeship programs.

Entry into many of the skilled trades, particularly in construction, has been based largely on the father-son tradition. This is a form of what we call "institutionalized racism" which simply means that the system has a built-in mechanism for keeping out Blacks and other minorities. I am convinced that the entrance tests are less important than the attitudes and behavior patterns of the people administering them. If apprentice sponsors want to take qualified Blacks, they can use the tests to do so. On the other hand, under present conditions apprentice sponsors can and have used tests to bar Blacks. We no longer need to be pre-trained before entering a 4 or 5 year training program.

I will now address the concept of the "home town" plans. Reno and Las Vegas were two of the 73 cities told by the Labor Department, last July 9th, to open more jobs for Blacks and other minorities in the construction trades this summer or face imposition of quotas by the Federal government. Labor Secretary J. D. Hodgson said that the Labor Department would give metropolitan areas every opportunity and assistance to work out agreements because experience shows that "hometwon" solutions provide broader opportunities than imposed solutions limited to Federal government contractors. (The Philadelphia Plan and the Washington Plan are the only two that have been imposed by the Federal Government.) Las Vegas reached an agreement with labor and management, finalizing its plan last week, while Reno is currently in negotiations. However, neither the Philadelphia Plan, nor any of 17 other Federally instigated big city plans, is working. That was the message brought to Washington, (See Levi, page 16)
