POST OFFICE NEWS

U. S. Post Offices will observe the following schedule during the Christmas weekend.

On Christmas Day, Friday, December 25, there will be no regular window, delivery or collection service. Only special delivery service will be available.

In many cities, post office lobbies will be open for mail deposit, access to lock boxes and purchase of stamps from self-service machines.

On Saturday, December 26, collection and lock box services will resume. Regular window service will be adjusted to meet the needs of each local community. Mail will be picked up from all deposit points for outgoing dispatch. However, there will be no regular delivery service. Only special delivery service will be provided.

Normal Sunday service will be in effect on Sunday, December 27. There will be collection, lock box and special delivery services.

Tornado victims in Lubbock, Texas, have had some of their problems eased with the donation of 55 VA homes for their use during readjustment.

Low-cost insurance totaling \$65.5 million was issued by the Veterans Administration to 6,942 veterans with service-connected disabilities during the first four months of 1970.

Department of Justice

A Columbus, Ohio, policeman was indicted by a federal grand jury today in the fatal shooting of a Negro youth during a burglary investigation.

Attorney General John N. Mitchell said an indictment charging Patrolman Robert A. Morgan with summary punishment was returned in the United States District Court in Columbus.

The indictment said Morgan shot and killed Charlie J. Cook, Jr., 18, on New Year's Day, 1970, in violation of the teenager's civil rights.

The maximum penalty upon conviction of the summary punishment statute, Title 18 United States Code, Section 242, is life imprisonment.
