Vegas, a program aimed to assist minority groups to earn an Associate Degree. The Associate Degree Program is a work study method in which part-time and summer employment is given to minority students attending the University. Additionally, the Company's Tuition Aid Program has been revisited allowing employees taking courses to be reimbursed 100 per cent. Specific efforts will be made to encourage minority employees to take full advantage of the opportunities offered under the program.

At the conclusion of the report on the "Plan", Strabala stated, "This year's program was prepared with the full awareness of our contracting force. We feel the goals we have established are realistic and achievable. We will make every effort to make it a success."

For the first time a VA program of loans for mobile home purchases are available to veterans -- up to \$10,000 for a home alone; up to \$17,500 with purchase of a lot.

Under a new law, there is no longer a terminal date for a G. I. home loan for any eligible veteran, including World War II and Korean Conflict veterans who never used this benefit.

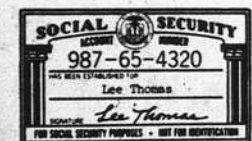
