

# INCOME TAX REFUND INFORMATION

Income tax refunds for Nevadans amounting to more than \$51,900 have been returned to the Internal Revenue Service as nondeliverable. "These refunds are for taxes paid in 1969 or for adjustments made on returns from prior years. They range in size from \$1.02 to \$1300," Warren Bates, Nevada IRS director, said today.

To claim his refund a "lost" taxpayer should complete a form at the IRS office, certifying his identity and stating he has not received a refund or his original check was lost, stolen, or destroyed, Bates said.

The Nevada IRS offices are located at 300 Booth St., Reno, and 300 Las Vegas Blvd. S. Las Vegas.

Missing refunds on tax returns filled in other states must be claimed through offices in those states. However, the local IRS can supply the necessary forms and the mailing addresses for such claims.

"The IRS hopes to disburse these checks in time to help taxpayers with their after-Christmas bills," Bates said.

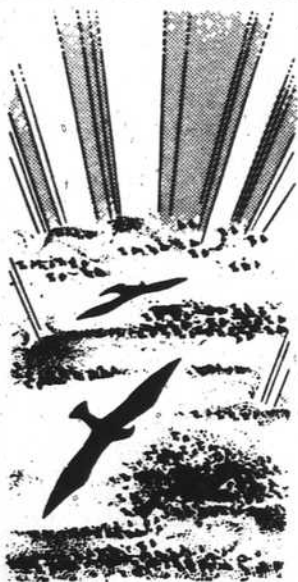
