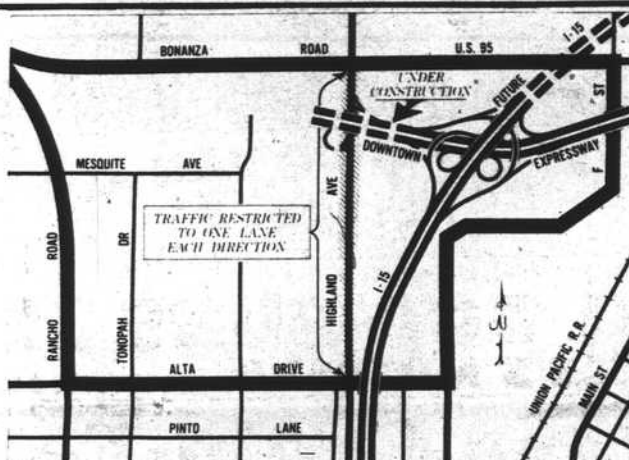

TO EASE CONGESTION - The State Highway Department above outlines alternate routes motorists might take to ease congestion on Highland Avenue during the construction of overpasses and ramps for the future Downtown Expressway from Interstate 15 to Rancho Road. Motorists might have to go somewhat out of their way on the suggested alternate routes, but they would be saving themselves the strain of short tempers when the traffic backs up through the construction zone. Traffic on Highland Avenue is restricted to one lane in each direction from Alta Drive to Bonanza Road. Alternate routes suggested by the Highway Department are Alta, Rancho, Bonanza or Alta, F Street, and Bonanza. Heavier lines indicate suggested alternate routes.

Taxpayers Ask IRS

Q) Taxes were withheld from a part-time job I had last spring. I don't have to file a return so how do I get this money back?

A) A return must be filed to obtain a refund. Attach W-2 statement showing the wages paid and taxes withheld to the Form 1040 you complete and send it to the Internal Revenue service center for your area.

Q) My mother just started collecting her social security pension. Does she have to pay tax on it?

A) No, social security benefits are not taxable and do not have to be reported.

Q) Do the tax tables in the instruction book include the surcharge?

A) No, after you have determined the amount of your tax from either the table or the schedules, you will have to add the surcharge. Use the surcharge tables in the 1040 instructions to determine the surcharge.

Q) Where can I buy a copy of your income tax guide?

A) A copy of Your Federal Income Tax, Publication 17, may be purchased for 75¢ and is sold at our offices. The Tax Guide for Small Business, Publication 334, costs 75¢ and is sold at our offices. They may also be purchased from the Superintendent of Documents, U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. 20402.
