EOB Family Planning - Neighborhood Health Program Offers Free Health Services

The Economic Opportunity Board of Clark County's Family Planning-Neighborhood Health Program provides a number of health services free of charge to low-income persons of the west Las Vegas/North Las Vegas target area.

Las Vegas/North Las Vegas target area. Included among the services offered at the Family Planning-Health Center, located at 940-A West Owens Avenue in the East Mall of the Golden West Shopping Center, are birth control counseling with complete personal instruction on use of various control methods and devices with professional assistance from a physican in determining most convenient method for the individual or couple, the Pap Smear (or cancer test), and Pregnancy tests for verfication of suspected pregnancy. The latter service is utilized by many for required verification by the State Welfare Department. The Program also offers infertility counseling for the couple who would like more children but who have not been able to have them.

Of major importance to residents who qualify for the free services of the Health Center is the Immunization Clinic for children. Immunization shots are given by a Public Health nurse for Diptheria, Tetanus, Whooping Cough, and Measles. Also provided are the Polio drink, and Small Pox Vaccination. Babies' shots should begin at 2 or 3 months of age. However, persons can receive immunization shots up to age 21.

Family Counseling is available for all the members of the Family to help solve personal problems that confront all families. Transportation is also provided free of charge, both to the Center and the return home or (in case of a child) to nursery, day care center, or babysitter.
