College. "Trilogy," "Lamp of God," and "Re-compense," are but three of the many songs he has written.

He has taught at the Jefferson Community Adult School, conducted many choral grounds for the City's Bureau of Music Choral Society, the Symphonic Choristers and was director of the Vermont Square Methodist Church's Sanctuary Choir, which, due to his continued pursuit of perfection and impeccable taste, has performed such outstanding choral works as Verdi's "Requiem" in Latin.

Wade entered teaching following a lucrative and rewarding three-year career as a concert artist in Seattle, Vancouver, Wyoming and Utah.

Delight Listeners

He used to delight the vast Hooper student body and faculty members by playing soft, classical music as they filed quietly into and out of the auditorium where he was ensconced.

Wade claimed still another first. While concertizing in Utah, he was invited to serve as Band Music Division Conductor for that state.

Said Alfred S. Moore, principal of Hooper, "He came to us and served with great distinction as a music teacher, but after a bit he was lured into the regular classroom as a sixth-grade teacher and there contributed much. Those of us who knew of his rich musical background urged, coaxed and begged him, finally with obvious success to return to his beloved field of music...and to once again share his unique and beautiful gift with the community."
