



Q. I am enrolled in both parts of Medicare. If I get a routine physical checkup by my family doctor every year, will Medicare pay for

A. No. Routine physical checkups are not covered under Medicare.

Q. I've been getting monthly social security benefits since I was 62. I'll be 65 in March 1971. What do I have to do to sign up for Medicare?

A. There are two parts to the Medicare program. You will automatically qualify for the hospital insurance part without doing anything. Hospital insurance, financed through employee and employer contributions to social security during a person's working years, requires no premium payments.

The other part of Medicare is medical insurance. You should receive a form in the mail several months before you are 65 asking if you want this part of Medicare. If you want the Medi-care medical insurance, complete this form and return it in the envelope furnished. This part of Medicare is financed by monthly premiums from people who sign up for medical insurance and by matching contributions from Government funds.


If you do not get the form, or if you have any other questions, call any social security office.

Q. I just turned 65 and applied for Medicare last week. I now find that I will have to go to the hospital very soon. What will happen if I do not have my card before I'm admitted?

A. You will be covered just as if you had your card. If necessary, the hospital can call the social security office to verify your Medicare coverage.
