## Students Will Remain Together Under Integration

Sixth grade students being rezoned to Westside schools and Quannah McCall will remain together by school, and Kindergarten through fifth grade students being moved from their neighborhoods will be rezoned contiguously, according to officials of the Clark County School District.

The move of black students to predominantly white schools and sixth graders into single-grade centers will give each metropolitan elementary school an enrollment somewhere eight and 20 percent black. Overall, the average will be about 12 percent black and 88 percent white.

Plans to implement the court-ordered integration plan are being made in case Federal Judge Bruce Thompson's ruling in December is not stayed or reversed. Thompson said no class could be more than 50 percent black after September.

School officials say relocations will be made as convenient as possible for everyone. There may be a few exceptions to keeping classes and neighborhoods together, however, because of the seating capacity of receiving schools.

But in all cases students will remain in elementary schools that feed into the same junior high and high schools.

## Free Rubella Clinic At L.V. Convention Center

A mass rubella clinic for all Clark County youngsters will be held Saturday at the Las Vegas Convention Center in an effort to end a threatening predicted epidemic of the disease which can cause pre-natal deaths and birth defects.

An estimated 10,000 Clark County youngsters need the immunization against the disease, according to Dr. Otto Ravenholt, Chief county health officer.

Children through ages one and ten years are eligible to receive the free shots at the District Health Department sponsored clinic slated between 10 a. m. and 4 p. m.

"We immunized more than 30,000 youngsters in our mass school immunization program during the past year," Dr. Ravenholt said. "However, we were unable to reach thousands of pre-school children and substantial numbers of other children who have moved into the community or were absent from school on dates shots were given."

Dr. Ravenholt noted that U. S. Public Health Service officials predict a repeat of the national-rubella epidemic of almost a decade ago.

"Federal health authorities estimate that more than 30,000 babies died before birth, plus, thousands in early infancy as a result of the last epidemic," Dr. Ravenholt said. "Some 20,000 infants were born handicapped."

While rubella or German measles is a mild childhood disease, it turns into a killer when contracted by a mother-to-be during the early months of pregnancy.

The mass clinic is receiving major support from Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, and Campfire Girls. Boy Scouts have provided signs for the inside of the Convention Center and will help guide families to Room 14 where immunizations will be given.

Girl Scouts and Campfire Girls are making posters and distributing flyers in their neighborhoods.

"We must take every possible step to prevent a serious outbreak of rubella in Clark County," Dr. Ravenholt said. "There is nothing more tragic than to see a rubella baby born with cataracts perhaps 90 per cent mentally retarded, and suffering from other birth defects."
