

A one-day seminar and "town hall meeting" to discuss busing and integration problems has been set for Saturday at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, Bob Bailey announced today.

The seminar sessions, open to parents of school age (grades 1-6) children of the community, will feature participation by school district officials, religious leades, and representatives of the black and white communities. Bailey said.

"We must all work together to find a sound, fair, solution to this problem," Bailey said, "for if we don't, it is our children who will be the losers. It is not a time for hysteria, it is a time for logic and rationality and regardless of the things that have been said in the heat of anger by some people recently, we better all get together and try to help instead of hinder." Bailey, a recent candidate for city commission, said he planned the seminar-town hall meeting for this time "to remove any political over-tones it might have had."

Morning and afternoon sessions have been scheduled for Saturday at UNLV, Bailey said, with the "Town Hall" segment slated for 5:30 p. m. when panel reporters and moderators will pre-(See Seminar page 11)
