commence June 6.

Dr. R. W. Brown Slated **For Honorary Degree**

Dr. Russell W. Brown, professor of microbiology in the School of Medical Sciences at University of Nevada, Reno, has been named to receive the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws from Tuskegee Institute of Alabama at its May 16 commencement exercises. Dr. Brown joined the Nevada staff for the fall semester in 1970 and was formerly vice president of Tuskegee Institute, as well as director of the Carver Research Foundation at Tuskegee.

Brown is respected among scientists for his research in viruses and cell and tissue culture, and participated in the development and testing of the Salk Polio Vaccine. He pioneered in the preservation of animal cells by liquid nitrogen refrigeration. Tuskegee president Dr. L. H. Foster said that Dr. Brown's selection is an honor due his "many and varied contributions to

higher education.

Dr. and Mrs. Mildred Brown make their home on Robin Hood Drive in Reno and are enthusuastic about their recreational and geological appeal of Nevada. Mrs. Brown, a former Tuskegee Physical Education instructor, is an avid photogra-pher and rock hound. Both she and Dr. Brown "can hardly waid for the next issue of the Desert magazine" and have already become

Nevadans in spirit as well as in residence.

Considering himself a "perennial student,"

Dr. Brown has studied at the University of Chicago and was a senior postdoctoral fellow at Yale University's School of Medicine, as well as holding degrees of Bachelor of Science from Howard University and Master of Science and Doctor of Philosophy degrees from Iowa State University.
