therefore a like reduction in O.O.A. will result in termination of his financial assistance from the State as well as Medicaid benefits."

Rev. Clark concluded that "The EOB is not concerned with where the fault lies, but with the fact that this is clearly a great wrong-a wrong," the Board Chairman stated "that MUST be made right."

Q. I am enrolled in both you want this part of Mediparts of Medicare. If I get care, If you want the Media routine physical checkup by my family doctor every year, will Medicare pay for

it? A. No. Routine physical checkups' are not covered under Medicare.

Q. I've been getting monthly social security benefits since I was 62. I'll be 65 in March 1971. What do I have to do to sign up for Medicare?

A. There are two parts to the Medicare program. You will automatically qualify for the hospital insurance part without doing anything. Hospital insurance, financed through employee and employer contributions to social security during a person's working years, requires no premium payments.

The other part of Medicare is medical insurance. You should receive a form in the mail several months before you are 65 asking if ******

City Commission candidate Paul Price has charged his opponent, Hal Morelli, with "Utter hypocrisy" and disclosed that Morelli has voted only three times in the last 23 years. "Yesterday, in an obvious attempt to appeal

to younger voters, Morelli advocated the passage of the 18-year-old vote. This is utter hypocrisy since Morelli himself has traditionally failed to exercise his own sacred right to vote." said Price.

Price said Clark County election department records document Morelli's failure to vote in elections.

'In more than two decades, Morelli cast only three votes except, of course, earlier this month when he did find time to go to the polls and vote

for himself," he said. "In view of his dismal failure to exercise such a basic democratic right, it is difficult to imagine that he, in good conscience, could be the advocate in requesting the vote for. someone else."

"This is not a smear or a personal attack on Mr. Morelli," he said. "Rather it is a simple statement of fact. Mr. Morelli can confirm or deny his failure to vote, or explain the reasons why he did not vote over the years. The records are available, there is plenty of time left before the election.'

'I point our Mr. Morelli's dismal voting performance because I am appalled that anyone with such an incredibly poor record at the polls would attempt to use voting rights for others as a campaign platform and because the people have a right to know how truly dedicated and allegedly 'concerned' this citizen really is," he said.

Price, who has one daughter 19-years old, said that he supports the lowering of the voting age 'because it would be unreasonable to allow our young people to vote for some offices and deny them a voice in others."

'I believe that younger Americans have a lot to contribute to our political process. I am confident that they will prove to be worthy of this responsibility.


THE LESSER OF **TWO EVILS**
