

They chose to be sentenced to work at the Boys' Club at 335 Jefferson; doing such things as: painting the building inside and out; supervising around the pool, chaperone the dances; and instruct youngsters in arts and crafts.

The Director of the Boys' Club, Mr. Ed Turner is very proud to have them and he wishes they could stay permantly because the ideas the mothers presented to him are very promising for the Boys' Club.
