

Free Dropouts Courses

Persons of any age who have not yet earned a high school diploma and who have been away from school for at least one semester may enroll in degree courses in adult education free of charge this fall, thanks to a new law passed by the 1971 Legislature.

The bill provides partial support to school districts to offer such courses in an effort to allow school dropouts to complete their educa-tion. Only courses leading to a high school diploma for qualified persons are free; other courses carry a minimum charge to make the Clark County School District's adult education program self-supporting.

Free courses are available to anyone who has been away from school for at least one semester and is not now enrolled in a regular educational program. Courses required for graduation include English, American history, American gov-ernment, and a choice from a wide selection of science and math offerings.

The Adult Education Department has always offered courses leading to a high school di-ploma, and every year several people earn their degree through the evening program. Until now, however, students have paid for each course. Persons interested in taking advantage of free courses are urged to call 384-9752 or 451-1040.
