## **2nd Prestige School**

The Clark County School Board will consider approval for the establishment of Joe Mackey Elementary School in North Las Vegas as a second prestige school under the voluntary integration plan Thursday (August 12) at 8:00 p.m. in the Board Room of the Education Center.

To date 530 white children have requested transfer to a prestige school, and school officials wanted at least 500 volunteers before establishing a second prestige school to relieve pressures on C.V.T. Gilbert.

At the same time 117 black students, not formerly participating in the voluntary integration program, was asked to be moved to

predominately white schools.

Joe Mackey and C.V.T. Gilbert will have additional resources and equipment, and will have approximately twice the staff of other schools through the use of Teacher Corps personnel. This means smaller classes and more individualized attention for students in kindergarten

through sixth grade.

Additional resources will be provided in all schools with large groups of black voluteers to provide more individualized student attention.

Black parents are free to transfer their children to any school with less than 25 percent black enrollment. Bus transporation is provided for all students, black and white, who transfer to help integrate schools. Persons interested in transferring their children are urged to phone 648-5755 or 736-5472.

Other agenda items this Thursday include approval for two juvenile prevention programs under the Omnibus Crime Control Act, several personnel appointments, and several items dealing with buildings and grounds.
