# ALL NEEDY STUDENTS WILL GET LUNCHES

Any student who qualifies under Federal guidelines for a free school lunch next year will get it, and all students participating in the voluntary elementary school integration program will be able to buy a lunch, according to Ed Greer, Associate Superintendent for Business and Financial Service for the Clark County School District.

The sack lunches, designated Type "A" by the U.S. Department of Agriculture because they provide at least one-third of a child's minimum daily nutritional requirements, will be provided to the school district by the Szabo Corporation of California, an institutional foods contractor. For students who pay, the meal will cost 40¢, including milk. Greer estimates that 7,000 sack lunches will be served per day at the beginning of school.

Hot lunches will continue to be served in all Henderson schools, at Indian Springs, Virgin Valley and Moapa Valley, at Lomie Heard and Paradise School in Las Vegas, and in all junior and senior high schools. These are the schools that have kitchens and facilities for serving hot meals.


C.V.T. Gilbert, Jo Mackey, Madison, Matt Kelly, Kit Carson, Kermit Booker, Marion E. Cahlan and Lois Craig also have lunches available to all students for purchase (again free to those who qualify), but they will be the Szabo sack lunch as opposed to the hot lunches transported to them last spring.

The three new schools, M. E. Ward, Cyril S. Wengert and Myrtle Tate, will have experimental, pre-packaged hot lunches available to all students.

School officials are hopeful that a lunch can be provided to every student who wants one within a short time, possible during the coming school year. A central food preparation facility is being constructed near uandhill and Bonanza Avenues capable of producing 40,000 lunches a day.

The school district's contract with Szabo is for one year. During that time district officials will be examining the merits of hot vs. sack lunches and whether it should contract food service or prepare its own lunches.

# STUDENT I.D. CARDS



STUDENT I.D. CARDS--All senior high school students and Clark County School District Staff members will have identification cards something like this for 1971-72.

All senior high school students will be provided with identification cards this year to allow administrators to determine immediately who does and does not belong on campus. Officials estimate it will take six weeks after school opens to provide cards to all students. The cards will bear the school's symbol and student's picture, and students will be expected to have their card in their possession at all times when on the school grounds or attending a school function. If a student transfers or withdraws from school, his identification card will be checked in with his books.
