## MOTORCYCLES---THE NEW LAW

CARSON CITY-Beginning January 1, 1972, 14 and 15 year-olds will no longer be eligible to apply for a power cycle (Class 5) drivers

This is a part of the new Motorcycle Safety
Law passed by the 1971 Nevada Legislature
which goes into effect the first of the year.

Division of the Department of Motor Vehicles said, "Those 14 and 15 year-olds who currently hold a valid power cycle drivers license will be permitted to drive power cycles after January 1, 1972 until the normal expiration of their

The new motorcycle law will be explained in its entirety on a half hour television special entitled, "MOTORCYCLES--THE NEW LAW." In Las Vegas the special can be seen on channel 10 at 7:30 on the evening of December 27th. The program will be shown in the Reno area on channel 2 at 4:30, immediately before the Peach Bowl Football Game on the afternoon of December 30th.

Holders of valid operators or chauffeur's licenses issued before January 1, 1970, are licensed to drive a motorcycle. For all those licensed after this date, a Class 4 (motorcycle) license or a Class 4 endorsement is required to operate a motorcycle in Nevada. The license (or motorcycle endorsement on the license) is valid for only two years.

In addition, those persons who have never been licensed to operate any motor vehicle prior to January 1, 1972, must successfully complete an approved motorcycle drivers training course before applying for a motorcycle license.-

CARSON CITY--After the first of the year, all persons driving or riding on motorcycles in Nevada will be required to wear protective

All aspects of the new Motorcycles Safety Law, which goes into effect January 1, 1972, will be explained in a half hour television special. The program, entitled "MOTORCYCLES--THE NEW LAW," can be seen in Las Vegas on channel 10 at 7:30 on the evening of December 27th. In Reno, the special can be seen on channel 2 at 4:30 in the afternoon on December 30th, just before the Peach Bowl Football Game.

The new motorcycle law stipulated that all helmets must meet or exceed the Z90.1 standard for protective headgear. This testing standard states that each helmet will be given two identical impacts in no less than four different places on the helmet.

Director Howard Hill of the Department of Motor Vehicles stated, "All helmet models meeting the Z90.1 requirement must be identified as such with a sticker attached to the inside of the helmet."

In conjunction with the protective headgear, both driver and passenger must also wear protective glasses, goggles or a face shield. If the motorcycle is equipped with an approved windshield,

the protective eyewear may be omitted.

"These regulations," said Hill, "apply not only to Nevada residents, but to all out-of-state motorcyclists driving their cycles in Nevada."

Branch offices of the Department of Motor

Vehicles as well as motorcycle dealers have been provided with lists of helmets which are Z90.1 approved...

(at least half of all physical complaints have emotionally related causes or side effects). Once industry is aware of the emotional aspects of underperformance, the second objec-

tive is to inform personnel executives of local resources available to employees with emotional problems. Kirby stressed that the gap that exists between the business community and mental health resources must be bridged.

The workshop on "The Troubled Employee"

is one of thirteen conducted during the meeting, designed to provide an information exchange among the one thousand Divisions and Chapters comprising the National Association for Mental Health. NAMH is the nation's only voluntary citizens' organization dedicated to fighting mental illness and promoting mental health.
