

NO NIX FOR NIXON AT BROWN'S BASH

WASHINGTON, D. C. - "For shear national impact the tribute to Robert Brown, special assistant to the President, was the biggest thing this town has seen since the "March on Washington." The words were those of Sen. Edward Brooke, but seemingly the combined feeling of the upwards to three thousand people who came to attend a deserved tribute to a wonderful human being. They were mainly Black and came from all over the nation. Some said that the only thing wrong with Bob Brown is that he works for the Nixon administration. If that is a grievious fault, it was not in evidence here Sunday nite. Though it was sold as a hon-ored hour for Robert Brown, the affair was as much a tribute to Pres. Nixon and Sammy Davis, Jr., as it was for the billed guest of honor.

Both the President and the total talented entertainer received standing ovations. Though the "in and out" chief executive was looked upon as a suprise guest, those close to the scene knew that he was coming. However, even the Republicans among the working committee were suprised by the warm reception, with no decending boos, he received. His words of praise for Bob and Sammy highlighted his short speech. He did not use it to dispell the Black belief the he's against the cause, but he did make it "perfectly clear" that his Black special assistant was the prodder of the administration.

TURN AWAY CROWD - The best known folks from the business, social, and political byways turned out to Bob's suprise on the nite of his tribute. In his modesty he never believed that what he had accomplished, as the Black voice in Nixon's ear, had meant so much to so many people. The affair was sold out a month in advance and the only national publicity it received was through this column, according to Willie Mason the main man behind the main event. In fact, the response was so great some \$35,000 had been refunded at the last count. There were so many wheels on board they had to set up a double dais. This took care of only a hundred of them, so the others, cabinet members, mayors, and supreme court justices were laced through the audience of 3,000 that was jammed into a space where 2,300 people normally dined.
