## Black Youth Turnout May Be Low: Sharpton

NEW YORK, N.Y.--A 17-year-old black youth leader said today that many black youths are "so disillusioned with the system" that they will not vote in November.

Even though 18-year-olds have the vote for the first time nationally, Rev. Alfred Sharpton, a young Pentecostal minister and head of the National Youth Movement, says many will not use it. The Rev. Mr. Sharpton, who has been active in black youth organizations in New York, formed the NYM last July and says that it has already enrolled 5,000 members around the country.

In an article in the current issue of ESSENCE magazine, Rev. Sharpton said the disillusionment of black youth stems, in part, from a 38 per cent unemployment rate among their group. "Black youth have been and are being trained not to work," he said. "They are adjusting us to accept welfare roles before we even get old enough to apply."

The youthful minister, who preached his first sermon at the age of four and was ordained at the age of 10, is highly regarded by black leaders around the nation. In July, 1971, Rev. Sharpton met with such black leaders as Manhattan Borough Pres. Percy Sutton, Harold Simms, of the National Urban League, and Bayard Rustin, the civil rights strategist, and won support and financing for his enterprise.

One goal, apparently, will be to oust President Nixon from the White House in the coming election. Interviewed by Marcia Gillespie, the Editor-in-Chief of ESSENCE, Rev. Sharpton said, "We've all got to organize around each other. In '72, we won't put Nixon out of the White House by wearing a dashiki or a wraparound on our heads or calling each other African names.

"That won't effect nothin'. The only way that we would defeat Nixon is by getting enough votes against Nixon to put somebody else in the House."

Black youth, he said, must have "a future in this country." He defined liberation as "the basics of life--food, clothing, shelter, quality, education and political power--a say-so in (the) country,"

Rev. Sharpton called upon young blacks to respect the established leadership in the civil rights movement for having "paved the way" for black youth today. He noted, "There's no generation gap in the Black community because all of us are oppressed. You're not oppressed because you're over 30 or under 30 in the black community. You're oppressed because you're black. I think as long as we're dealing on the basis that we must be free then there's no gap there."
