and Food Distribution Center officials. Agreement was reached that in the future the Food Center would pack the food, and EOB staff would continue delivery.

In November, two days before and two day after the Thanksgiving Holiday, food was packed by Center personnel. Walt Bajgler, Center staff member, requested that the EOB staff and/or volunteers sign pink and white (delivery check list) sheets before delivery. Mr. Watts, Senior Citizens Coordinator, agreed to comply with the understanding that when food not delivered was returned to the warehouse the pink and white sheets for each food box would be pulled from his file and destroyed. Mr. Watts notes that apparently this was not done by his office for each delivery not made and where the food was returned to the warehouse.

On December 15, Mrs. Peggy Smith, EOB Emergency Food Coordinator, asked for a Fair Hearing for John Galbraith. On December 21, Mr. Watts called the Food Center to ascertain delivery schedule for the next month. He was told no food could be deivered until after New Year's.

On January 3, Mrs. Peggy Smith requested a Fair Hearing for Mrs. Myrtle Jackson. On January 3 and 7, Food deliveries were made by the EOB program after being packed by the Center. On three of the routes, the Center packed exactly double the amount of butter allotted. This, of course, was returned to the Center and a signed receipt requested for it, as well as for any boxes not delivered.

On January 2 and 4, Mr. Watts called to schedule end of January's deliveries for February. He was told that the Food Center had delivered most of the Food and would deliver the

remainder.
