Joe Neal, a long time resident of Clark County has filed his candidacy for the State Senate in district #4. This district was created through reapportionment of the State by the Legislature in 1971, a position that Neal had advocated over the years.

Neal is head of the largest poverty program in Las Vegas. He is chairman of the Economic Opportunity Board. Neal is also chairman of the Greater Las Vegas Plan, a plan that is designed to bring 18% of the minorities into the Building Trades Unions.

Neal is known for his courage in taking on the Building Trades Unions and the hotels when they would not open up their employment doors to Blacks.

Neal's work in employment has generated approximately six million dollars annually in wages and salaries that come into this com-


