Therewere not many of them it is true, but some of our brothers and sisters joined us. It was very fitting, in that setting, to have this young white musician play his own arrangement of 'Amazing Grace" on that old piano that has played accompaniment to so much grief and aspiration. Even among us, who have the monopoly on Soul, it was a hit." Here's hoping that Mayor Charles Evers can call the same attention to this young man that Mayor Dick Hatcher had focused on the Jackson-5.
