Abdul-baha Speaks on The Baha'i Principles

This is the third in a series of talks Abdul-Baha gave to the Theospophical Society, in which he explains the principles of the Baha'i Faith. These principles were given by Baha'u'llah, Prophet-Founder of the Baha'i Faith, over one hundred years ago.

V. The fifth principle of Baha'u'llah is: Prejudices of Religion, Race or Sect destroy the foundation of Humanity.

All the divisions in the world, hatred, war and bloodshed, are caused by one or other of these prejudices.

The whole world must be looked upon as one single country, all the nations as one nation, all men as belonging to one race. Religions, races, and nations are all divisions of man's making only, and are necessary only in His thought; before God there are neither Persians, Arabs, French nor English; God is God for all, and to Him all creation is one. We must obey God, and strive to follow Him by leaving all our prejudices and bringing about peace on earth.

VI. The sixth principle of Baha'u'llah is:

Equal opportunity of the means of Existence. Every human being has the right to live; they have a right to rest, and to a certain amount of well-being. As a rich man is able to live in his palace surrounded by luxury and the greatest comfort, so should a poor man be able to have the necessities of life. Nobody should die of hunger; everybody should have sufficient clothing; one man should not live in excess while another has no possible means of existence.

Let us try with all the strength we have to bring about happier conditions, so that no single soul may be destitute.

JOBS FOR VETERANS CAMPAIGN GREAT !

CARSON CITY--Jobs found for veterans by the Nevada Employment Security Department reached a new high of 515 in May.

Department chief Robert Archie said last month's (May) job placement for Nevada's exservicemen is the agency's best performance in the past 11 months of the "Jobs for Vet-erans" campaign.

The record number of jobs found for the state's ex-servicemen in May topped April's total by 58 new wage earners.

The 515 veterans who became new jobholders last month (May) included 237 Vietnam veterans, which Archie said is another high for monthly job placement of newly discharged servicemen and women.

The state's free job service has found work for 3,358 veterans since last July, said Archie. The 11-month total includes 1,401 Vietnam veterans.
